
Weekly Reading Goal Sheets

- Analyses
 - Students will complete reading reflections and analyses in response to a specific prompt
- Conferences
 - Individualized discussions based on weekly lessons and students' personal goals

Grammar

- Taught within the context of each unit of study
- Invited to notice grammar patterns and deduce the rules from these patterns
- Opportunities to explore rules in their independent reading books and apply rules in their own writing.
- 7th grade skills:
